Next steps to finalize Lane Fire Authority merger

Veneta, Ore. – Voters in Lane County Fire District 1 and Lane Rural Fire/Rescue approved a merger by wide margins during the November 8 General Election. The fire districts have been working together under the name "Lane Fire Authority" since 2012 and will keep the name moving forward.

There are several steps the fire districts must complete before the merger is finalized. First, the boards of both fire districts must meet separately within five days of the election being certified by Lane County. The purpose is to pass a resolution accepting the election results.

The second step is to elect a governing board of five members for the new agency. Based on population, three board members will serve from Lane County Fire District 1 and two from Lane Rural Fire/Rescue. There will be a joint meeting of both fire district boards for this purpose.

At the same meeting, the new board for Lane Fire Authority passes a resolution declaring that the fire districts have officially merged. This resolution completes the merger process.

These meetings will take place on Thursday, December 1 starting at 6:00 p.m. at the Veneta Headquarters Station at 88050 Territorial Highway in Veneta.

There will be a new levy rate for the fire authority, which will replace the existing levy for each fire district. The Lane County Assessor's Office will finalize the rate based on assessed valuations as of December 1, 2016, when the merger is finalized. The new levy rate will take effect on July 1, 2017.
